Old / New Business

Public Hearing and Acceptance of Blackwater Park

City Manager Amanda Jarratt stated since 2017 there have been ongoing discussions regarding the creation of Blackwater River Park. The park is located on the State scenic Blackwater River. The park includes a unique boardwalk, wetlands, and the protection of 140 acres of a virgin Cypress Tupelo swamp. Visitors will be able to walk through an intact forest, utilize interpretive signage, and observe the flora and fauna located at this park which is located at the confluence of two VDCR registered Stream Conservation Units. Over \$1.2M in grant funds have been obtained on the City of Franklin's behalf to enable the construction of the park which is now ready to be conveyed to the City of Franklin.

The Blackwater Park will be managed by Sammara Green-Bailey, Director Parks & Recreations.

Mayor Frank Rabil opened the Public Hearing for the Acceptance of Blackwater for speakers.

Being there were no speakers Mayor Frank Rabil closed the Public Hearing.

Mayor Frank Rabil opened the floor for discussion.

Mayor Frank Rabil entertained a motion to authorize City Manager Amanda Jarratt to execute all of the necessary documents to close the gift on the Blackwater River Park.

Councilman Linwood Johnson made a motion to authorize Mayor Frank Rabil and City Manager Jarratt to execute all of the necessary documents to close the gift on the Blackwater River Park. The motion was seconded by Councilman Mark R. Kitchen.

Public Hearing Pretlow Industrial Park Rezoning

City Manager Amanda Jarratt asked Natalie Rountree, Director of Community Development to come forward and review the rezoning of a portion of Parcel 155-(186)-1.

Director Rountree gave the following review:

The City of Franklin owns the above referenced property. Currently, the property has three zonings. Two applications have been submitted to rezone two of the three zones. The parcel is located on the west side of Pretlow Street, north of Highway 58, and south of Morton Street.

Application one, RZ21-001 is to amend the zoning map designation of approximately +/- 44.08 acres currently zoned R-O, One Family Residential to M-2, Heavy Industrial.

Application two, RZ21-002 is to amend the zoning map designation of approximately +/- 29.85 acres currently zoned M-1, Light Industrial to M-2, Heavy Industrial.

The current owner seeks a zoning map amendment to have the R-O and M-1 zonings changed to M-2 to allow heavy industrial activities and related uses including light industrial activities and retail business associated with industrial activities.

The Comprehensive Plan notes the portions of the property currently zoned R-O and M-1 zonings changed to M-2 to allow heavy industrial activities and related uses including light industrial activities and retail business associated with industrial activities.

Public Works has been consulted regarding the request and its impact on City utility services. The City will expand the substation located on said parcel to accommodate future growth.

Mayor Frank Rabil opened the public hearing for speakers.

Speaker 1

Ricky Sykes, resides at 421 Morton Street, Franklin, Virginia; Mr. Sykes stated he is not against Global Concentrate moving their business to the City of Franklin, but expressed his concern regarding the close proximity of the business to the residences.

Speaker 2

Karl Heck, President of Franklin/Southampton Economic Development; Mr. Heck spoke in support of Global Concentrate coming to the City of Franklin to operate their business.

Speaker 3

Karen Ealey, resides at 703 Banks Street, Franklin, Virginia; Ms. Ealey stated she is in support of new businesses coming to the City of Franklin, but has the same concerns as Mr. Sykes.

Speaker 4

Wendy Whitehead, resides at 336 Robinhood Road, Franklin, Virginia; Ms. Whitehead expressed traffic concerns regarding Global Concentrate coming to the City of Franklin.

Mayor Rabil reminded everyone that City Council will just be approving the rezoning and not the site planning. The site planning will be the next phase.

Councilwoman Wynndolyn Copeland asked City Manager Jarratt to explain Global Concentrate's process regarding traffic.

City Manager Jarratt stated that Global Concentrate will be bringing raw products and materials will come in from the port off of Highway 58 and then take the Pretlow exit to access the Industrial Park. The finished products will then be transported by Interstate 95 or Highway 58 back to the port to be shipped.

Councilwoman Copeland asked if there was a timeline.

Director Rountree answered a timeline is not available at this time.

Mayor Frank Rabil entertained a motion to approve the recommendation by the Planning Commission to rezone RZ21-001, approximately +/- 44.08 acres currently zoned R-O, One Family Residential, to M-2, Heavy Industrial.

Approval of Sale of Pretlow Industrial Park – Global Concentrate

City Manager Amanda Jarratt gave the following background information:

Global Concentrate is a New Jersey based supplier for traditional and organic fruit and vegetable juice concentrates, purees, puree concentrates, NFC (not-from-concentrate) juices and IQF (individual quick freezing) products, has announced that it will be purchasing approximately 170 acres of industrial land in the Pretlow Industrial Park in Franklin to establish their largest processing operation in the United States.

Global Concentrate currently operates in Turkey, Europe, Far East Asia, China, South America and Canada as well as the United States. Global Concentrate looks forward to strong growth in Franklin, as it has experienced in other countries throughout the world. The company currently makes and sells private-label juices sold at retailers such as Aldi's, Dollar General and Trader Joe's. Global Concentrate also sells juice concentrate to companies including Tropicana, Campbell Juice, and Kirkland.

Global Concentrate will invest a minimum of \$121 million in tangible business property, real estate and construction, and machinery and tools in Franklin. A total of 50 new full-time jobs will be created in Franklin within 36 months. Attached are necessary contract documents to facilitate the closing of the property at a price of \$2 million.

The Performance Agreements and contracts were approved at the September Franklin City Council meeting. We are hoping to close by the first week in December. It is anticipated that that construction will begin in 2022. The job creation will occur over a 36-month period as build-out is completed at the Pretlow site. Anticipated build-out for Global Concentrate will be approximately 2,000,000 square feet of new building space.

Mayor Frank Rabil entertained a motion to approve Resolution 2021-27 as well as the sale of the Pretlow Industrial Park to Global Concentrate and authorize City Manager Amanda Jarratt to execute all necessary documents to close on the sale of the property to Global Concentrate also known as Voorhees Warehousing Corporation.

City Manager's Report

City Manager Amanda Jarratt gave the following updates:

General Updates

- The City of Franklin staff continues to work with local, regional, and state partners to battle the impacts of COVID-19 and provide testing and vaccinations throughout the City.
- Work at Hunterdale Elementary School is expected to be complete by the close of the Thanksgiving weekend and Southampton County has commercial movers on standby beginning Thursday, December 2. Plans are to get all staff and equipment moved between December 2 and December 10, with the first trial scheduled at Hunterdale Elementary School on December 13th. Work at the Southampton County Courthouse should begin in early December – we have our preconstruction meeting for that set on December 7 at 1:00 p.m. The County has leased the former Registrar's Office (across the street from the Courthouse) to Heartland for their use as a construction project office. They have also agreed to allow them to use space in front of, and behind, the County Office Center for materials and equipment staging.
- Attached is the 2022 Holiday Schedule for your review and adoption. City Code indicates that the City of Franklin shall observe all State and Federal Holidays.
- The Angel Tree is housed at the Social Services Department for anyone that would like to participate; presents will need to be back by December 17, 2021, wrapped with the angel tag attached to the gift.
- City Manager Jarratt stated she has a meeting scheduled with Senator Lucas on November 23, 2021 with the Isle of Wight County Administrator, City of Suffolk's City Manager and the Jail Superintendent of the Western Tidewater Regional Jail to discuss the Federal Overhead Recovery. City Manager Jarratt added she would be scheduling a meeting with Delegate Wachsmann as well

Background

A public hearing will be held on Monday, December 13, at 7:00 PM, during the regular scheduled meeting of the City of Franklin Council to appropriate \$5,736,288 awarded to Franklin City Public Schools (FCPS) via the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) ESSR III Act. In addition, net appropriations totaling \$1,078,800 from various federal and state revenue sources was awarded to FCPS. The Code of Virginia, §15.2-2507, requires a public hearing when amendments to the budget to adjust the aggregate amount to be appropriated exceed 1% of total expenditures, and requests for appropriation for these relief funds exceed this threshold.

Needed Action

Conduct the public hearing and adopt the following budget amendments.

BUDGET AMENDMENT 2022-8

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, VIRGINIA that the 2021-2022 City Budget is hereby amended to:

1. recognize the School's supplemental appropriations of Federal, State, local and grant revenues and to appropriate for use; and
2. appropriate funds from FY21 restricted fund balance in the School Operating Fund to spend on one-time capital expenditures.

On behalf of Governor Northam, it gives me great pleasure to inform you that City of Franklin has been awarded \$135,226.30 in federal State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) through the American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) for the COVID-19 ARPA SLFRF Municipal Utility Assistance Program. Your award shall be used to directly assist residential municipal utility customers of City of Franklin with arrearages greater than 60 days for the time period between March 12, 2020, and August 31, 2021. This funding is being provided under CFDA 21.027 – Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF).

Please read the additional program guidance included with this letter carefully before proceeding with additional steps. Given the tight timeline for utilization of these funds and to receiving funds in an expedited manner, you must return the attached forms through a web portal. You are required to partner with a city or county to act as the fiscal agent to receive the funds from the Department of Accounts (DOA). The city or county will then forward funds to the municipal utility to apply to eligible residential utility customer accounts. In order to pre-qualify your eligible residential utility customer accounts and apply relief automatically, you will need to complete the Utility Arrearage Analysis in Appendix A. Once the project is complete, DOA will follow up regarding project outcomes and compliance. It is incumbent on City of Franklin and the partnering city or county to ensure project expenses are properly documented and verified in case of audit.



City Treasurer's 2021 Annual Report

Delinquent Taxes as of
November 30, 2021

- 
- ▶ The delinquent tax amount for the City of Franklin as of November 30 2021 is \$389,405.92. This amount reflects tax years 2019 and older for all taxes owed to the city. The last collection report dated November 30, 2020 was reported with delinquencies of \$428,376.58. This is a reduction of \$38,970.66 along with adding the 2019 tax year.

Real Estate:

- ▶ As of November 30, 2021 there is \$139,389.86 in delinquent Real Estate taxes for the years 2003-2019. The delinquencies consist of 59 residential, 8 multi-family, 13 commercial and 1 tax exempt for a total of 81 properties. The cumulative collection rate for these tax years is 99.83%. The office continues to work with citizens who have become delinquent with payment plans prior to collection actions. We currently have 10 taxpayers on monthly payment plans. The office will research taxpayers through VEC (Virginia Employment Commission) for employment information and attach a lien against their place of employment based on the Code of Virginia 58.1-3919. Currently the office has about 8 wage liens.
- ▶ The Treasurer's office continues to work with Jason A. Dunn, PLC (Tax Attorney) out of Virginia Beach to assist in selling properties who meet the requirements for a tax sale based on the Code of Virginia, 58.1-3965. There are currently 51 properties being worked by Mr. Dunn's firm. Prior to sending the file to the firm, the office has exhausted all possible efforts with the citizen.

Real Estate Cont...

- ▶ Prior to properties being sold at a tax sale, Mr. Dunn's firm will enter into a payment plan with the taxpayer. Once they enter into a plan the taxpayer must stay current on the plan and pay all current taxes by the due date.
- ▶ Due to the pandemic we were unable to have a tax sale in 2020. We monitored how things were going in 2021 and opted to have a hybrid (online and in person) tax sale. We had 8 properties finalized to go to sale. Prior to the sale 2 properties were paid in full and pulled from the sale. I was very impressed as to how the hybrid tax sale went and will continue to have tax sales this way. This gives a wider foot print of people bidding on the properties that otherwise might not be able to make it to the actual sale. All bidders must qualify prior to being able to bid on properties. The auction held in 2021 brought enough money to pay all the delinquent taxes as well as the attorney's fees and auctioneer's fees.

Real Estate Cont...

- ▶ After the courts approve the highest bid, funds are disbursed to the City. If there are additional funds remaining and the property owner owes other monies to the city, I can then request for those funds to satisfy the other delinquencies. Any remaining funds is sent to the clerks office for a period of two years. If no one claims the funds the courts return the unclaimed funds to the City after two years.
- ▶ I'm anticipating having a tax sale sometime the first part of 2022.
- ▶ For RE2020 tax year, of the 5.5 million budgeted, we have \$114,656.01 uncollected, showing a 98.8 % collection rate as of November 30, 2021. Any payments paid on delinquent real estate is applied to the oldest tax first.

Personal Property:

- ▶ As of November 30, 2021 this is \$249,821.33 in delinquent personal property taxes for tax years 2014-2019. The cumulative collection rate for these years is 98%. Due to the pandemic there was a delay in adding DMV Stops to delinquent vehicles due to the DMV offices being closed to the public and later having to make appointments to be able to handle business. We have resumed adding DMV Stops to delinquent personal property taxes. We continue to work with taxpayers on monthly payment plans. Plans are usually made so that their taxes are satisfied prior to the next years assessments and due date. Any and all prior delinquent taxes must be satisfied prior to being able to make a new payment plan. We still have not resumed doing any vehicle seizures for delinquent taxes. I will be meeting with Virginia Auction Co to see what new procedures have been put in place prior to resuming this action.

Personal Property Cont...

- ▶ For PP2020 tax year, of the 2.8 million budgeted, we have \$126,511.64 uncollected, showing a 94% collection rate as of November 30, 2021. With the new Edmunds Software, we are able to add the DMV Stop fees at the time of placing the Stop which causes the delinquent amount to be increased. This also applies to all delinquent tax years.
- ▶ Due to the Statue of Limitations as per Code of Virginia 58.1-3040, I will be requesting City Council to approve charging off personal property tax year 2014 in the amount of \$20,352.11. Based on years of collection attempts, I deem these accounts uncollectable.

Meals and Lodging

- ▶ Currently there are no delinquent Meals Taxes that have filed with the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office.
- ▶ Currently there are no delinquent Lodging Taxes that have filed with the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office.



Business License:

- ▶ As of November 30, 2021 there are 2 delinquent business license in the amount of \$194.73. These 2 businesses are no longer in operation and the owners have not been located. We continue to use all treasurer's tools to locate the owners.

The Treasurer's Office was awarded the Office of Accreditation for the Eighth year in a row by the Treasurer's Association of Virginia. This is the highest award given by the association. One requirement to receive this award the office must have a collection rate of 95% or higher for Real Estate and 90% or higher for Personal Property.

Reference: November Elections

Background

During the First Special Session in 2021, the General Assembly passed and the Governor signed Senate Bill 1157 requiring City and Town governing bodies to pass an ordinance moving May elections for Mayor, governing bodies, and school boards to November. Attached for your adoption is the required resolution.

Needed Action

Adopt the resolution as presented.

**AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH ELECTIONS AT THE TIME OF THE
NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION**

WHEREAS, Virginia Code § 15.2-1400 recently was amended to require that all city elections be held on at the time of the November general election with terms to begin on January 1 of the succeeding year, notwithstanding any other Code provisions or Charter provisions to the contrary; and

WHEREAS, the elections for the City of Franklin City Council members and for Mayor heretofore have been held in May of each year for terms to begin on the succeeding July 1; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the recent amendment to Va. Code § 15.2-1400, the City of Franklin City Council wishes to adopt this Ordinance to establish that all elections on or after January 1, 2022 be held at the time of the November general election for terms to begin on the succeeding January 1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Franklin, Virginia as follows:

1. That notwithstanding any provision of the City Charter to the contrary, for any election held after January 1, 2022, elections of the Mayor and members of the City Council shall be held at the time of the November general election for terms to commence on the succeeding January 1. The inaugural meeting of a newly elected council shall take place on the date of the first regularly scheduled meeting of the City Council in the month of January following the November election.
2. That no term of any mayor or a member of City Council shall be shortened in implementing this change to the November election date. The Mayor and members of the City Council who were elected at a May general election and whose terms are set to expire as of June 30 shall continue in office until their successors' terms commence on the January 1 following their election at the November general election.
3. That this ordinance shall be effective on and after January 1, 2022.

Reference: Camp Community College Updated Memorandum of Understanding

Background

As you recall in August of 2019 Franklin City Council entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with Camp Community College regarding a shared employee and the use and maintenance of the athletic fields located at Armory Field. Since that time, Dr. Lufkin has departed and Dr. Corey McCray has been appointed to the permanent position. The use of one of the buildings is now also included this MOU. All other terms and conditions remain the same.

Needed Action

Provide authorization for the Franklin City Manager to execute the updated Memorandum of Understanding.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, VIRGINIA
AND
PAUL D. CAMP COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter the “MOU”) is entered into this ___ day of December 2021, by and between the CITY OF FRANKLIN, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia (hereinafter the “City”) and PAUL D. CAMP COMMUNITY COLLEGE, ON BEHALF OF THE STATE BOARD FOR COMMUNITY COLLEGES (“hereinafter “PDCCC”). The City and PDCCC may hereinafter be referred to jointly as the “Parties”.

WHEREAS, the Parties have a common interest in promoting athletic activities in the City of Franklin;

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to reach an agreement as to the use, cost and maintenance of the athletic fields at the Armory Athletic Complex (the “Complex”) owned by the City commonly known as Armory Drive Recreational Park in the City of Franklin, Virginia;

WHEREAS, PDCCC wishes to utilize the Athletic fields and facilities at the Armory Athletic Complex for PDCCC’s softball, football, soccer and baseball athletic programs; and

WHEREAS, PDCCC wishes to provide maintenance of the Complex for the benefit of the City and PDCCC and the City desires to reimburse PDCCC for a portion of the costs therefor; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants and restrictions herein contained, the Parties agree as follows:

1. PDCCC shall be allowed to use the athletic fields and other facilities at the Armory Athletic Complex, including the football field (which also serves as a soccer field and a baseball field) and is adjacent to the football and softball field. The areas covered by this MOU are shown on the attached plans. PDCCC will be permitted to utilize the City maintenance building located within the Armory complex, including without limitation the restrooms, and PDCCC will also be permitted to use the metal building located in the Armory parking lot, for PDCCC’s athletic programs. For all students using the metal building, PDCCC will provide signed liability waivers by each student.

2. PDCCC shall provide all grounds maintenance and lawn care for the Athletic fields which may include but are not limited to such items as fertilization, seeding, aeration, field grading and top-dressing infield/outfield as well as mowing the grass and weed control as needed.

3. PDCCC will provide daily custodial maintenance of the adjacent metal building. All other expenses associated with the building will be the responsibility of the City.

4. PDCCC will coordinate scheduling its games and practices at the Athletic fields with the City's Parks & Recreation Department.

5. PDCCC will provide quarterly invoices to the City within ten (10) days of the end of each quarter for the maintenance service and employment of a part-time employee (29 hours/week) for field maintenance.

6. City will be responsible for paying half the cost of the part-time employee for field maintenance and pay each quarterly invoice within thirty (30) days of receipt of PDCCC's invoice by the City.

7. City shall be responsible for purchasing materials and supplies associated with the maintenance of the athletic fields. All other expenses associated with the Complex will be the responsibility of the City.

8. City shall allow PDCCC to use all City equipment located at Complex for field maintenance.

9. City shall provide PDCCC access to and use of all Athletic fields and facilities at the Armory Athletic Complex which include without limitation the Baseball Field at 100 N. College Drive and the Softball Field at 920 Armory Drive Franklin, VA within the facilities schedule established by Franklin Parks & Recreation.

10. The Parties acknowledge and agree that each party shall be responsible for its own acts and omissions, and for those of its respective officers, employees, and students related to use and maintenance of the Complex and the athletic fields and building.

11. The covenants and restrictions contained herein shall apply to and bind the Parties and their heirs, representative, successors and permitted assigns.

12. The terms of this MOU will remain in effect until terminated by any Party. Termination may only occur after providing ninety (90) days written notice to the other Party.

13. The Parties agree that this MOU shall be deemed to have been made in Virginia and that the validity and construction of this MOU shall be covered by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Parties further agree that any legal action or proceeding arising out of this MOU shall be commenced and tried in the Circuit Court of Southampton County.

Background Information

After years of negotiation there are been two nationwide settlement agreements that would resolve all opioid litigation brought by various states and local political subdivisions against the three largest pharmaceutical distributors, McKesson, Cardinal Health and AmerisourceBergen, Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc., and its parent company Johnson and Johnson.

The Commonwealth of Virginia is a participating state, and all settlement funding will flow to localities through direct appropriations and through the Opioid Abatement Authority. Both litigating and non-litigating localities can receive distribution if they enter into an MOU and the Settlement Agreement.

The Memorandum of Understanding was approved at the October City Council meeting. The Settlement Participation Form must be executed and uploaded no later than January 2nd.

The governmental entity identified above (“Governmental Entity”), in order to obtain and in consideration for the benefits provided to the Governmental Entity pursuant to the Settlement Agreement dated July 21, 2021 (“Distributor Settlement”), and acting through the undersigned authorized official, hereby elects to participate in the Distributor Settlement, release all Released Claims against all Released Entities, and agrees as follows.

1. The Governmental Entity is aware of and has reviewed the Distributor Settlement, understands that all terms in this Election and Release have the meanings defined therein, and agrees that by this Election, the Governmental Entity elects to participate in the Distributor Settlement and become a Participating Subdivision as provided therein.
2. The Governmental Entity shall, within 14 days of the Reference Date and prior to the filing of the Consent Judgment, dismiss with prejudice any Released Claims that it has filed.
3. The Governmental Entity agrees to the terms of the Distributor Settlement pertaining to Subdivisions as defined therein.
4. By agreeing to the terms of the Distributor Settlement and becoming a Releasor, the Governmental Entity is entitled to the benefits provided therein, including, if applicable, monetary payments beginning after the Effective Date.
5. The Governmental Entity agrees to use any monies it receives through the Distributor Settlement solely for the purposes provided therein.
6. The Governmental Entity submits to the jurisdiction of the court in the Governmental Entity’s state where the Consent Judgment is filed for purposes limited to that court’s role as provided in, and for resolving disputes to the extent provided in, the Distributor Settlement.
7. The Governmental Entity has the right to enforce the Distributor Settlement as provided therein.



8. The Governmental Entity, as a Participating Subdivision, hereby becomes a Releasor for all purposes in the Distributor Settlement, including but not limited to all provisions of Part XI, and along with all departments, agencies, divisions, boards, commissions, districts, instrumentalities of any kind and attorneys, and any person in their official capacity elected or appointed to serve any of the foregoing and any agency, person, or other entity claiming by or through any of the foregoing, and any other entity identified in the definition of Releasor, provides for a release to the fullest extent of its authority. As a Releasor, the Governmental Entity hereby absolutely, unconditionally, and irrevocably covenants not to bring, file, or claim, or to cause, assist or permit to be brought, filed, or claimed, or to otherwise seek to establish liability for any Released Claims against any Released Entity in any forum whatsoever. The releases provided for in the Distributor Settlement are intended by the Parties to be broad and shall be interpreted so as to give the Released Entities the broadest possible bar against any liability relating in any way to Released Claims and extend to the full extent of the power of the Governmental Entity to release claims. The Distributor Settlement shall be a complete bar to any Released Claim.
9. The Governmental Entity hereby takes on all rights and obligations of a Participating Subdivision as set forth in the Distributor Settlement.
10. In connection with the releases provided for in the Distributor Settlement, each Governmental Entity expressly waives, releases, and forever discharges any and all provisions, rights, and benefits conferred by any law of any state or territory of the United States or other jurisdiction, or principle of common law, which is similar, comparable, or equivalent to § 1542 of the California Civil Code, which reads:

General Release; extent. A general release does not extend to claims that the creditor or releasing party does not know or suspect to exist in his or her favor at the time of executing the release that, if known by him or her, would have materially affected his or her settlement with the debtor or released party.

A Releasor may hereafter discover facts other than or different from those which it knows, believes, or assumes to be true with respect to the Released Claims, but each Governmental Entity hereby expressly waives and fully, finally, and forever settles, releases and discharges, upon the Effective Date, any and all Released Claims that may exist as of such date but which Releasors do not know or suspect to exist, whether through ignorance, oversight, error, negligence or through no fault whatsoever, and which, if known, would materially affect the Governmental Entities' decision to participate in the Distributor Settlement.
11. Nothing herein is intended to modify in any way the terms of the Distributor Settlement, to which Governmental Entity hereby agrees. To the extent this Election and Release is interpreted differently from the Distributor Settlement in any respect, the Distributor Settlement controls.
