City Treasurer's 2024 Annual Report

Delinquent Taxes as of
December 31, 2024

- ▶ The delinquent tax amount for the City of Franklin as of December 31, 2024 is \$496,120.50. This amount reflects tax years 2022 and older for all taxes owed to the City. The last collection report dated November 30, 2023 was reported with delinquencies of \$513,377.49. From last annual reporting shows a decrease of \$17,256.99 with the adding of tax year 2022.

Real Estate:

- ▶ As of December 31, 2024 there is \$119,037.57 in delinquent Real Estate taxes for the years 2003-2022. The delinquencies consist of 40 residential, 5 multi-family, 17 commercial for a total of 62 properties. The cumulative collection rate for these tax years is 99.76%.
- ▶ The office continues to work with citizens who have become delinquent with payment plans prior to collection actions. We currently have 10 tax payers on monthly payment plans. The office uses VEC (Virginia Employment Commission) for employment information and will attach a lien against their place of employment based on the Code of Virginia 58.1-3919. Currently the office has about 8 with wage liens.
- ▶ The Treasurer's office continues to work with Jason A. Dunn, PLC (Tax Attorney) out of Virginia Beach to assist in selling properties who meet the requirements for a tax sale based on the Code of Virginia, 58.1-3965. There are currently 18 properties being worked by Mr. Dunn's firm. Prior to sending the file to the firm, the office has exhausted all possible efforts with the taxpayer.

Real Estate Cont...

- ▶ Prior to properties being put up for a tax sale, Mr. Dunn's firm will enter into a payment plan with the taxpayer. Once they enter into a plan with the firm the taxpayer must stay current on the plan and pay all current taxes by the due date.
- ▶ In 2024 we didn't have any tax sales. We had two properties that became eligible for a tax sale, but satisfied the delinquencies prior to setting the sale date. A tax sale is the last results for collecting the real estate taxes. We do our best to keep the property owner in their properties. We are currently working on a tax sale for 2025. No date has been determined at this time.
- ▶ For prior tax sales dating May 2022, there were surplus funds held with the Clerk of Court for the required two years. We received surplus funds in 2024 in the amount of \$37,718.90 from the Clerk of Court.
- ▶ For RE2023 tax year, of the 6.6 million budgeted, we have \$110,485.24 uncollected, showing a 98.4 collection rate as of December 31, 2024. Any payments paid on delinquent real estate is applied to the oldest taxes first.

Personal Property:

- ▶ As of December 31, 2024 there is \$344,660.20 in delinquent personal property taxes for tax years 2017-2022. The cumulative collection rate for these years is 97.3%.
- ▶ The office continues to place DMV-Stops on delinquent taxes. This is a great tool used by Treasurer's office across the Commonwealth. Taxpayers cannot renew their tags or licenses until they have the Stop removed which requires the taxes be paid in full. We continue to work with taxpayers on monthly payment plans. Plans are usually made so that their taxes are satisfied prior to the next years assessments due date. Any and all prior delinquent taxes must be satisfied prior to being able to make a new payment plan.
- ▶ Due to the Statue of Limitations as per The Code of Virginia 58.1-3040, I will be requesting City Council to approve charging off personal property taxes for tax year 2017 in the amount of \$23,059.65. Based on years of collection attempts, I deem these accounts uncollectable.
- ▶ In working with the Commissioner of the Revenue, we have accounts that the property owner are deceased and the property has been junked and no longer on the active DMV records. These accounts will also be charged off.

Business License:

- ▶ As of December 31, 2024 there are 7 delinquent business license in the amount of \$6,685.49. One business has closed and no longer in the area and has been turned over to the tax attorney where a judgement has been filed. We continue to work with the other business owners to satisfy their business licenses.

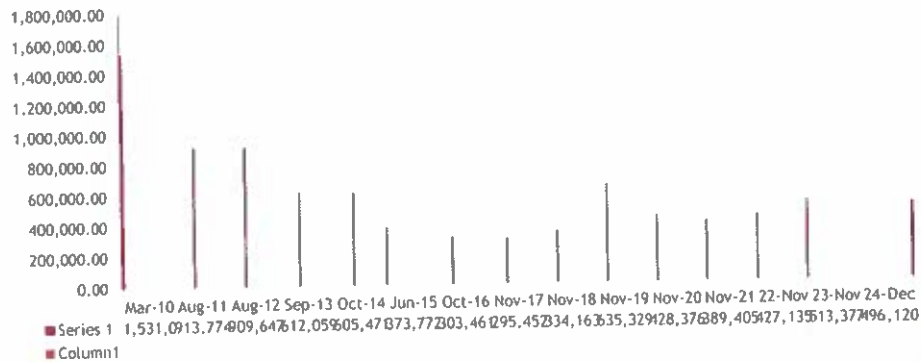
Meals and Lodging:

- ▶ Currently we have four business that have delinquent meal tax in the amount of \$25,737.24. Two of the restaurants have closed their doors leaving money owed to the city. I have turned them over to my tax attorney and we have gone to court and obtained a judgement on the owners. My next step is to file criminal action against the owners. Meals tax is a fiduciary tax and the funds are to be held in trust until they are required to turn over the funds to the locality when due. When funds are used for other then what they are collected for the owners could be arrested and do jail time. I'm working with the other two restaurants that are newer to the locality by putting them on a payment plan to bring them current.
- ▶ There are currently no delinquent lodging taxes.

Collection Percentage Rate for the Office:

- ▶ Cumulative Percentage for Real Estate for 2003-2022 is 99.76%
- ▶ Cumulative Percentage for Personal Property for 2017-2022 is 97.31%

The Treasurer's Office was awarded the Office Accreditation for the eleventh year in a row by the Treasurer's Association of Virginia. This is the highest award given by the association. To receive this award the office must have a collection rate of 95% or higher for Real Estate and 90% or higher for Personal Property along with meeting other requirements set by the association. Offices are audited after the office submits their application.

I also received the 2024 Commonwealth Award from the Treasurer's Association of Virginia at the 92nd Annual Conference. I was very humbled and appreciative to have been nominated and given this very prestigious award from my peers across the commonwealth.



Chapter 8. Electric Utility

Article II. Service Charges

§ 8-15. When due and payable.

[Code 1962, § 24-6, amended by Ord. No. 2025-2, March 10, 2025]

- (a) All bills for electric service furnished by the City shall become due and payable when presented, and all accounts shall be paid on or before the 20th of the month in which the bill is rendered.

RESOLUTION 2025-10

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CONCURRENCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN WITH THE INDUCEMENT RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF REVENUE BONDS FOR THE BENEFIT OF BON SECOURS MERCY HEALTH, INC. AND SOUTHAMPTON MEDICAL CENTER.

WHEREAS, Bon Secours Mercy Health, Inc. (“BSMH”) is a Maryland nonstock nonprofit membership corporation, and which has facilities located in the City of Franklin, Virginia including Bon Secours Southampton Medical Center (“Southampton Medical Center”) located at 100 Fairview Drive, Franklin, Virginia 23851; and

WHEREAS, on January 16, 2025, the Economic Development Authority of Henrico County, Virginia (the “Henrico Authority”) adopted an inducement resolution (the “Inducement Resolution”) (a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment A) relating to the issuance of its Health Facilities Revenue Bonds (Bon Secours Mercy Health, Inc.) (the “Bonds”) in one or more series to, among other things, (i) finance or refinance the costs of certain capital expenditures, including the acquisition, construction, equipping, expansion, enlargement and improvement of certain hospital facilities, including reimbursement, (ii) pay a portion of the interest on the Bonds, if deemed necessary, (iii) establish one or more debt service reserve funds, if deemed necessary, and (iv) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bonds (collectively, the “Financing Purposes”), all pursuant to a master financing plan for certain health care facilities affiliated with BSMH, which plan includes the above-described financing by the Henrico Authority for the benefit of BSMH and its nonprofit affiliates, including Southampton Medical Center; and

WHEREAS, the portion of the Bonds to be issued for the benefit of the Southampton Medical Center facilities shall not exceed \$15,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Bonds will be issued pursuant to the Industrial Development and Revenue Bond Act, Chapter 49, Title 15.2, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the “Act”), and will be limited obligations of the Henrico Authority payable solely from the revenues and receipts derived from payments provided by BSMH; and

WHEREAS, the facilities of Southampton Medical Center to be financed or refinanced are located within the boundaries of the City of Franklin; and

WHEREAS, Section 15.2-4905 of the Act permits the issuance of the Bonds by the Henrico Authority for the benefit of BSMH and its nonprofit affiliates, including Southampton Medical Center, if the governing body of the City of Franklin concurs in the Inducement Resolution adopted by the Henrico Authority; and

WHEREAS, Section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”), provides that an “applicable elected representative” of the governmental unit having jurisdiction over the area in which any facility financed or refinanced with the proceeds of the Bonds is located must approve the issuance of the Bonds in order for the interest on the Bonds to

be entitled to certain exemptions from taxation provided by the Code, and the City Council of the City of Franklin, Virginia, as an elected legislative body, constitutes such applicable elected representative within the meaning of the Code; and

WHEREAS, on February 20, 2025, pursuant to the requirements of Section 147(f) of the Code and the Act, the Henrico Authority in a joint undertaking with the City of Franklin and the County of Chesterfield, Virginia held a public hearing concerning the proposed issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, a Summary of the statements expressed at the public hearing have been filed with the Council; and

WHEREAS, at this time, BSMH is requesting that the City Council of the City of Franklin, Virginia concur in the Inducement Resolution of the Henrico Authority and approve the issuance of the Bonds by the Henrico Authority to comply with Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4905 of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, VIRGINIA:

1. The recitals made in the preamble to this Resolution are hereby adopted as a part of this resolution.

2. The City Council of the City of Franklin, Virginia, approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Henrico Authority for the benefit of BSMH and its nonprofit affiliates, including Southampton Medical Center, and concurs in the Inducement Resolution adopted by the Henrico Authority for all purposes for which such concurrence and approval is required, including without limitation, Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4905 of the Act.

3. The approval of the issuance of the Bonds, as required by Section 147(f) of the Code, and the concurrence in the Inducement Resolution adopted by the Henrico Authority as required by Section 15.2-4905 of the Act, does not constitute an endorsement to a prospective purchaser of the Bonds of the creditworthiness of BSMH, nor does it constitute indebtedness of or a pledge of contributions from the City of Franklin, Virginia. Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the City of Franklin is pledged to the payment of the principal or interest on such Bonds or any other costs related thereto. Neither the City of Franklin nor any of its representatives, commissioners, officers or employees shall have any liability for or related to the Bonds.

4. The City Clerk is hereby instructed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Henrico Authority and representatives of BSMH.

5. This Resolution shall take effect on the date of its adoption.

**Inducement Resolution With
Respect to the Proposed Issuance of

WHEREAS, Bon Secours Mercy Health, Inc., is a Maryland nonstock, nonprofit corporation (“BSMH”) qualified to conduct business in the Commonwealth of Virginia (the “Commonwealth”); and

WHEREAS, BSMH along with its affiliates (the “Affiliates”) operate a nonprofit healthcare system (the “System”) in seven states and the Republic of Ireland that includes acute care hospitals, behavioral health facilities, long-term care and rehabilitation facilities, home health agencies, physician clinics, hospice facilities, clinical laboratories, and ambulatory surgery centers; and

WHEREAS, the System owns and operates the following facilities in the Commonwealth: (i) Bon Secours Mary Immaculate Hospital in Newport News, Virginia, (ii) Bon Secours Maryview Medical Center in Portsmouth, Virginia, (iii) Bon Secours Health Center at Harbour View in Suffolk, Virginia, (iv) Southampton Medical Center in Franklin, Virginia, (v) St. Francis Medical Center in Chesterfield County, Virginia, (vi) St. Mary’s Hospital in Henrico County, Virginia, (vii) Rappahannock General Hospital in Lancaster County, Virginia, (viii) Bon Secours Memorial Regional Medical Center in Hanover County, Virginia, (ix) Ashland Emergency Center in Hanover County, Virginia, (x) Richmond Community Hospital in Richmond, Virginia, (xi) Bon Secours – Southside Medical Center in Petersburg, Virginia and (xii) Bon Secours – Southern Virginia Medical Center in Emporia, Virginia (collectively, the “Hospital Facilities”); and

WHEREAS, BSMH has requested that the Economic Development Authority of Henrico County, Virginia (the “Authority”) issue one or more series of its Health Facilities Revenue Bonds (Bon Secours Mercy Health, Inc.) (the “Bonds”) in order to (i) finance or refinance the costs of certain capital expenditures, including the acquisition, construction, equipping, expansion, enlargement and improvement of certain of the Hospital Facilities, including reimbursement, (ii) pay a portion of the interest on the Bonds, if deemed necessary, (iii) establish one or more debt service reserve funds, if deemed necessary, and (iv) pay certain expenses incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bonds (collectively, the “Financing Purposes”); and

WHEREAS, the Bonds will be issued pursuant to the Virginia Industrial Development and Revenue Bond Act, Chapter 49, Title 15.2, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the “Act”), and will be limited obligations of the Authority payable solely from the revenues and receipts derived from payments by BSMH; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 15.2-4905 of the Act, if a locality other than Henrico County, Virginia has created an industrial development authority pursuant to the Act, the Act does not permit the Authority to finance facilities within the boundaries of such locality unless the governing body of the locality where the facilities are located concurs with the inducement resolution of this Authority and shows its concurrence in a duly adopted resolution; and

WHEREAS, the independent cities of Newport News, Portsmouth, Suffolk, Franklin, Richmond, Petersburg and Emporia, Virginia and the counties of Hanover, Chesterfield and Lancaster, Virginia, have each created an industrial development authority pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of the Bonds is contingent upon the adoption of concurring resolutions by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Hanover, the County of Chesterfield and the County of Lancaster, and the City Council of each of the Cities of Newport News, Portsmouth, Suffolk, Franklin, Richmond, Petersburg and Emporia pursuant to the Act; and

WHEREAS, in materials submitted to the Authority, and in its appearance before the Authority, BSMH has described the Financing Purposes and the benefit thereof to BSMH in providing quality medical care to the residents of Henrico County and the other localities in the Commonwealth served by the System; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that financing the costs of the Financing Purposes by the Authority for the Hospital Facilities and BSMH will protect and promote the health and welfare of the inhabitants of the Commonwealth of Virginia and in particular of Henrico County and surrounding environs, will reduce the cost of providing medical care to residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia and in particular Henrico County and the aforementioned cities and counties, will be in the public interest and will be consistent with and serve the purposes of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Economic Development Authority of Henrico County, Virginia:

(1) It is hereby found and determined that financing the costs of the Financing Purposes will reduce the cost of providing medical care to residents of the Commonwealth of Virginia and in particular Henrico County, Hanover County, Chesterfield County, Lancaster County, and the Cities of Newport News, Portsmouth, Suffolk, Franklin, Richmond, Petersburg and Emporia and surrounding environs, will be in the public interest, will protect and promote the health and welfare of the inhabitants of the area served by the Authority, and will be consistent with and serve the purposes of the Act.

(2) In order to finance the costs of the Financing Purposes, the Authority hereby agrees to issue its Bonds, upon terms and conditions to be mutually agreed upon among the Authority, BSMH and the purchasers of the Bonds, and subject to the requirements of the Act.

(3) Payment of the Bonds shall be secured by an assignment, for the benefit of the holders thereof, of the Authority's rights (excluding the Authority's rights to indemnification, fees, expenses and notice) under notes or other obligations of BSMH requiring payments sufficient in the aggregate to pay all principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds.

(4) The Bonds may be issued in one or more series issued on one or more dates, shall bear such title or designation, shall bear interest at such rate or rates, shall be in such denominations, shall be offered for public sale or private placement, shall be subject to such terms of redemption, shall be in such form, and shall contain such other terms and conditions as may be approved by the Authority.

(5) It having been represented to the Authority that it is necessary to proceed immediately with the Financing Purposes, the Authority hereby authorizes BSMH to proceed with their plans for the Financing Purposes and to take steps as they may deem appropriate in connection therewith, provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to authorize BSMH to obligate the Authority without its consent in each instance to the payment of any moneys or the performance of any acts in connection with the Financing Purposes. The Authority agrees that BSMH may be reimbursed from the proceeds of the Bonds for all such costs it shall incur or have so incurred to the extent permitted by the Act and applicable Federal law.

(6) The Authority hereby agrees to the recommendation of BSMH that Dinsmore & Shohl LLP, be appointed as bond counsel, and hereby appoints such firm to supervise the proceedings and approve the issuance of the Bonds.

(7) At the request of BSMH, the Authority hereby appoints RBC Capital Markets and JPMorgan Securities LLC, as underwriters for the purchase and sale of the Bonds pursuant to terms to be mutually agreed upon.

(8) If requested by BSMH or bond counsel, the Authority shall, at the expense of BSMH, make application to the Internal Revenue Service for such tax rulings as may be necessary or desirable in connection with the issuance of all or part of the Bonds, and the Chairman and the Vice Chairman of the Authority are hereby authorized to execute an appropriate power of attorney naming such counsel as BSMH may request for the purposes of seeking such ruling.

(9) The Secretary of the Authority is directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia. The Authority hereby recommends that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia, approve the issuance of the Bonds after a public hearing (as to which proper notice is given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation) in accordance with the provisions of Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Act.


(10) Nothing contained in this resolution shall require the expenditure of any funds of the Authority for any purpose whatsoever except such as may be derived from the proceeds of the Bonds issued pursuant hereto, it being understood that BSMH will reimburse the Authority for all reasonable and necessary direct out-of-pocket expenses that the Authority may incur arising from the adoption of this resolution and the performance by the Authority of its obligations hereunder and that are not paid with the proceeds of the Bonds, including the Authority's fees and expenses, including counsel fees. In addition, BSMH shall pay to the Authority a one-time fee in accordance with the Authority's fee schedule, payable upon the issuance of the Bonds. If for any reason such Bonds are not issued, it is understood that all such expenses shall be paid by BSMH and that the Authority shall have no responsibility therefor.

(11) This resolution shall take effect immediately and shall expire one year from the date hereof unless the Bonds are issued within such time.

Title: Budget Amendment – International Paper/Arbor Day Foundation Grant

Issue:

- Adopt a resolution amending the FY 2024 – 2025 City Operating Budget to accept and appropriate the \$26,250 to the Foundation Grant Funds for use by the Department of Parks and Recreation for tree planting at River Walk Park.

Background:

- In 2019, International Paper partnered with the Arbor Day Foundation to plan and distribute trees in areas impacted by natural disasters. Shortly thereafter, the partnership expanded its efforts to include community events that promote the interconnected health and well-being of people in urban and rural communities and their natural environments.

Discussion:

- On March 13, the Department of Parks and Recreation was awarded a grant of \$26,250 to plant trees at River Walk Park. The grant period will begin on May 2, 2025, and end on June 30, 2025.

The Arbor Day Foundation (hereafter called ADF), and International Paper have jointly awarded a International Paper Tree planting award to City of Franklin Parks and Rec (hereafter called Awardee). This Award Agreement delineates the terms and conditions of this award.

In order to receive your award, complete this Award Agreement. Please sign, scan, and email this Award Agreement back to ADF. Payment to Awardee is contingent on ADF receiving an original signed Agreement, a completed W-9, proof of insurance, and Awardee's compliance with the terms of this Agreement. Your signature on this Agreement acknowledges your acceptance of all terms included in this Award.

TERMS

ADF and Awardee may modify the description, terms, and/or timeline of the project upon request of Awardee and at the discretion of ADF and International Paper. In addition, if International Paper decides to postpone or reschedule the timeline for the award, project and/or Event Date with ADF for any reason, ADF may similarly postpone or reschedule the timeline for such award, project and/or Event Date hereunder with Awardee without liability. ADF may, upon written notification, cancel this Award Agreement in the event the Awardee has failed to comply with the description, terms, and/or timeline of the project as described in this Award Agreement.

Awardee agrees to notify ADF of any organizational changes occurring during the term of this award, including, but not limited to, changes in key personnel, address or other contact information, and/or changes in tax classification under the U.S. Internal Revenue Code.

Awardee certifies that it owns the Project site or has legal authorization to utilize the site for the Project described in the Award application submitted by Awardee.

Awardee certifies that it maintains general liability insurance from an insurance company acceptable to ADF that is lawfully authorized to issue insurance in the jurisdiction where the Project site is located as will protect Awardee from claims that may arise out of or result from any business conducted by Awardee, any property that Awardee owns, other services that Awardee may provide or any other actions of Awardee necessary to complete the Project. This general liability insurance will include

products and completed operations coverage, with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Awardee shall also maintain workers compensation insurance with the statutory limits for the state in which the work is performed as well as employers' liability with policy limits of \$500,000 each accident. Certificates of insurance together with copies of the endorsements naming ADF as an additional insured shall be delivered to ADF prior to Awardee's commencement of the Project and from time to time upon request of ADF. Any such policy maintained by Awardee will provide that it may not be terminated nor may coverage be reduced except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice to ADF.

Awardee agrees to use ADF's template photo, video, intellectual property, and liability waiver and provide scanned copies post-event of all signed releases. Copy of waiver subject to change due to liability requirements designated by ADF.

Awardee agrees to comply with all applicable requirements of the USA Patriot Act and Executive Order 13224, and all subsequently enacted legislation, executive orders, or regulations, designed to prevent any Award funds from being used in support of terrorism or a terrorist organization.

The undersigned declares that Awardee operates in accordance with ADF's nondiscrimination policy and does not discriminate against any person or group on the basis of age, political affiliation, race, national origin, ethnicity, disability, sexual orientation, or religious belief.

Significant changes to the funded Project generally will not be approved. If minor changes become necessary, they must be requested in advance and receive approval from ADF. Awardee will notify ADF immediately in the event that any of the following occur:

- The Awardee is unable to use any portion of the Award funds for the intended purposes
- The Awardee is unable to comply with any of the terms of this Agreement
- Any Award funds are used in a manner inconsistent with the terms of this Agreement

ADF reserves the right, in its sole discretion:

- To withhold any payments provided for under this Award, to recover from the Awardee any unexpended Award funds, and, if the terms of this Agreement are violated by Awardee, to require restitution by the Awardee of any previously expended Award funds
- To require the Awardee to take reasonable precautions to prevent any diversion of Award funds
- To withhold any applicable taxes from any Award payments

This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties and their successors, but otherwise shall not be assignable by any party or transferable by operation of law or otherwise.

Awardee shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless ADF and International Paper, as well as their respective trustees, directors, officers, employees, agents, successors and assigns (collectively, "Indemnified Parties"), from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses, judgments, damages or expenses and charges of any kind or nature including interest, reasonable attorneys' fees and other costs, expenses and charges which any of the Indemnified Parties may at any time incur, sustain, or

become subject to by reason of any third party claim, action, suit, demand or investigation arising out of (a) Awardee's acts or omissions related to the Project or the use of the Award Funds as well as the acts or omissions of any person claiming under Awardee; and (b) any breach, violation or nonperformance by Awardee or any person claiming under Awardee of any term, covenant or provision of this Award Agreement or any law, ordinance or governmental requirement of any kind.

FINANCIALS

ADF will disburse the Award funds in two payments. The first payment of \$21,000.00 will be disbursed upon the return of an original signed Award Agreement, a completed W-9 form, and proof of insurance listing the Arbor Day Foundation as an additional insured. A final payment of \$5,250.00 will be disbursed upon satisfactory completion of the project and receipt of a final project report. Funds paid to Awardee, shall be used exclusively for the International Paper Tree Planting Project.

This award is made for use until June 30, 2025. Awardee shall maintain records of expenditures of Award funds and make books, records, and personnel available to ADF and its agents as appropriate. Awardee agrees to cooperate with ADF with regard to any such monitoring or evaluation.

Award funds and any interest earned thereon shall not be used:

- A. To carry on propaganda, or otherwise to attempt to influence legislation (within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"));
- B. To participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office (within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Code);
- C. To make any awards to individuals or organizations (unless pre-approved in writing by ADF).
- D. No part of the Award funds shall be paid to any ADF official, and Awardee acknowledges that no gifts or services were or will be rendered to ADF or any ADF official in exchange for this Award.

Notwithstanding anything stated herein, this Agreement shall terminate and all further disbursements or expenditures of the Award by Awardee shall cease if (i) any of the facts contained in Awardee's award proposal cease to be correct and accurate; (ii) if Awardee fails to perform any of the requirements of this Agreement; or (iii) International Paper notifies ADF of its decision to indefinitely postpone the award, project and/or Event Date. In such event, Awardee shall immediately return any unexpended portion of the Award to ADF, and ADF shall have no obligation to disburse any additional amounts payable under the Award, regardless of any claimed adverse effect on the programs or operations of the Awardee.

EXECUTION

During the award period, the Awardee will achieve the following outcomes with regards to your International Paper Planting Project:

- A. Develop and adhere to a project timeline, culminating in a planting on 5/2/2025.
- B. Provide regular updates for communication with ADF staff and partners as applicable
- C. Plant and maintain a minimum of 20 trees.
- D. Obtain all necessary permits and permissions for the Project, including securing and long-term space maintenance plans, insurance and legal land use zoning and permits.
- E. Manage and educate approximately 35 volunteers on tree planting, care, and maintenance best practices
- F. Allow for participation by International Paper employees in the planting event.

- G. Provide or ensure two years of maintenance and care for trees, to ensure healthy establishment
- H. Promote the event using media in the local area in coordination with ADF and International Paper to recognize International Paper and other applicable partners
- I. Submit 1-2 event photos within 24 hours via the Post Event Photo Form. This resource will be shared prior to the event day.
- J. Complete a Final Project Report including impact stories no later than 10 business days post-event. Included in final reporting will be day-of submissions of high-quality event photos. The final report template will be made available prior to the completion of your event.
- K. Meet all covenants and metrics as outlined in the Awardee's International Paper Tree Planting Project proposal to be superseded by this Agreement should any discrepancies present.

During the award period, ADF will:

- A. Distribute International Paper "Award Funds" to Awardee as outlined in financial section above.
- B. Provide a Final Project Report in advance of the report due date

PROMOTION

All marketing drafts must be received by ADF at least 5 weeks before the event date to allow for adequate review, approval, and distribution timelines. ADF requires that Awardee include the name and logo of ADF and International Paper on all project-related promotional materials. All logos will be supplied to Awardee in a useable format. Awardee shall not assign or distribute the ADF or International Paper logos for any reason other than promotion of this award project. Awardee agrees not to alter either the ADF or International Paper logos in any way including color, fonts, ratio dimensions, background, and/or layout.

Awardee hereby authorizes Arbor Day to include its trademarks in mutually agreed-upon advertising copy, solely in connection with this Agreement, subject to prior review and approval of such use by Awardee which shall not be unreasonably withheld. ADF hereby authorizes Awardee to use ADF's trademarks (the "Arbor Day Marks") solely in connection with this Agreement, subject to prior review and approval. Except as otherwise expressly permitted hereby, neither party shall use the other party's Marks without the prior express written consent of such party.

Public announcements of the Award may be made by the Awardee, ADF, or International Paper. Any related press release, media alert, website posting, or other public announcements about the Program or the Award must acknowledge that the Awardee is a "proud partner of the Arbor Day Foundation," and that the Program is "made possible by partnership with the Arbor Day Foundation and International Paper."

ADF and International Paper must review and approve any public announcements (fliers, original press releases, e-blasts, etc.) at least two weeks prior to distribution.



Title: Replacement of HVAC Unit for Blackwater Regional/Ruth Camp Campbell Memorial Library

Issue:

- Adoption of a resolution to amend the FY 2024-2025 City Operating Budget/Capital Improvement Program to move the amount of \$47,685 from the General Fund's Unassigned Fund Balance and appropriate the said amount into the Capital Fund for replacement of the HVAC unit at the Blackwater Regional/Ruth Camp Campbell Memorial Library.

Background:

- The HVAC system was installed over 10 years ago and has reached the end of its operational lifespan. It no longer effectively regulates temperature and air quality, which is crucial for preserving library materials and ensuring a comfortable environment for visitors.

Discussion:

- The outdated system has been experiencing frequent breakdowns, resulting in increased maintenance costs and diminished comfort for patrons and staff. The system finally stopped working in early March 2025.
- Public Works is requesting an amendment to the current budget to allocate funds to replace the HVAC System, as it was not part of the original estimated capital cost for the fiscal year. The estimated cost of the new system is \$47,685, which includes equipment, installation, and any necessary modifications to the building infrastructure.
- To fulfill this request, an allocation from the unassigned fund balance account to purchase the HVAC unit.
- The library entrance is mostly glass, which will pose a problem as the temperatures warm up.
- The timely replacement of the HVAC system at the Blackwater Regional/Ruth Camp Campbell Memorial Library is essential for maintaining an optimal environment for library employees and users as we approach the summer season.

Financial impact:

- The FY 2024 – 2025 City Operating Budget/Capital Improvement Program will increase by said amount and, the unassigned General Fund's Fund Balance will reduce by the said amount.

Recommended Action:

- Adoption of the Resolution.

Title: Pretlow Communication Tower Purchase

Issue:

- Adoption of a resolution to amend the FY 2024-2025 City Operating Budget/Capital Improvement Program to move the amount of \$125,000 from the General Fund's Unassigned Fund Balance and appropriate the said amount into the Capital Fund for purchase of the Pretlow Communication Tower as part of the public safety radio systems project.

Background:

- The City is collaborating with Southampton County to upgrade its public safety radio system. As part of these upgrades, the City needs to install equipment on the Pretlow Communication Tower located behind the Franklin Police Department to enhance communication and coverage in the area.

Discussion:

- During the negotiation process with TVT II, LLC for an agreement to allow the installation of radio equipment on the tower, the owners presented an option to purchase the tower instead of entering into a lease agreement. Initially, the City considered a lease of \$1,000 monthly for 15 years, with a 3% annual escalation. By the end of the lease, this arrangement would have cost the City over \$240,000. Additionally, adding equipment to the tower in the future would be necessary, increasing the cost.
- By purchasing the tower, the City would save over \$100,000 and avoid future expenses associated with installing new equipment. Furthermore, owning the tower would provide the City with the potential to generate revenue from future leases.

Financial impact:

- The FY 2024 – 2025 City Operating Budget/Capital Improvement Program will increase by said amount and, the unassigned General Fund's Fund Balance will reduce by the said amount.
